Biography for Prof. Andrew Knight

Whilst a Western Australian veterinary student in 2000, Andrew Knight caused controversy by refusing to kill animals during his surgical and preclinical training. Instead, he helped establish a humane surgical training program, based partly on neutering homeless animals from animal shelters.

Andrew is now a European, American, New Zealand and RCVS-recognised Veterinary Specialist in animal welfare. He is Professor of Animal Welfare and Ethics, and Founding Director of the Centre for Animal Welfare, at the <u>University of Winchester</u>, where he created and leads a distance-learning MSc in Animal Welfare Science, Ethics and Law. He has numerous academic and popular <u>publications</u> and a series of YouTube <u>videos</u> on animal issues, and has delivered over 170 presentations on animal welfare issues at universities and conferences internationally. These include an extensive series examining the contributions to human healthcare, veterinary and other education, of invasive procedures on animals, which formed the basis for his 2010 PhD and his subsequent book, <u>The Costs and Benefits of Animal Experiments</u>.
